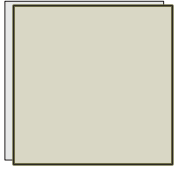
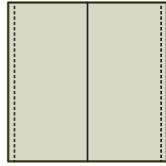


Ways to Use a 5" Square!

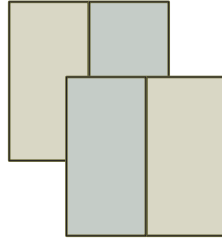
What can I do with a 5" square?



Place 2-5" x 5" right side together



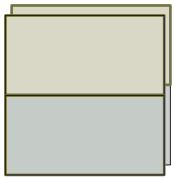
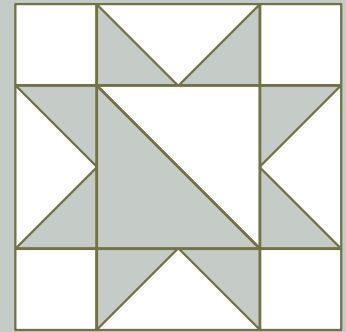
Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on outside edges
Cut in half



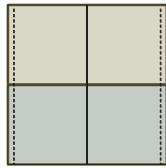
Press open to make 2 "pieced" charms
 $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5" with seams

Cutting your own 5" squares!

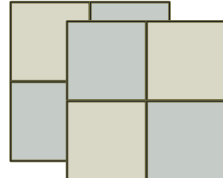
- 1/4 yard = 8 squares
- 1 Fat Quarter = 12 squares
- 1/2 yard = 24 squares
- 3/4 yard = 40 squares
- 1 yard = 56 squares



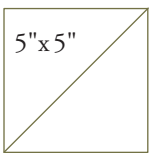
Place 2 "pieced" charms right side together (nest seams)



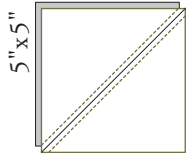
Stitch a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on outside edges
Cut in half



Press open to make 2-4 patch blocks
 $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " with seams



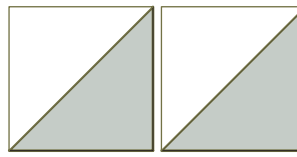
Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side.



Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the line.



Cut apart on the diagonal line.

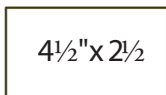


Press open to make 2 half square triangles.
 $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " with seams

Easy corner triangles



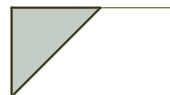
2 1/2"



$4\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2 1/2"

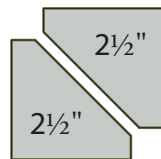


Sew



$2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " with seams.
2" x 4" finished

Use a scrap saver ruler.
